Official launch of the Oceania Geospatial Symposium (OGS)

Vaimu'a Muliava, member of the government in charge of the digital transition and the development of technological innovation as well as relations with the overseas collectivities of the Pacific, will lead a press conference for the official launch of the Oceania Geospatial Symposium (OGS), in visual collaboration with representatives of French Polynesia and Wallis and Futuna, Friday 9, September at 9am (UTC +11:00), at Pacific Community (SPC). They will be accompanied by French State and the partners of the event.

This event is a first-of-its-kind, in that it is co-sponsored by New Caledonia, French Polynesia, Wallis and Futuna and the French State via the Pacific Fund. The Oceania Geospatial Symposium will be held in partnership with the SPC, the Group on Earth Observations (GEO), the National Centre for Space Studies (CNES), and the initiator of this symposium the ART GeoDEV, which includes the New Caledonian Research and Development Institute (IRD NC), the University of New Caledonia (UNC) and the start-up INSIGHT SAS, from the New-Caledonian group CIPAC, specialized in imagery on earth observation data.

The Southern, Island and Northern provinces, as well as the two mayor's associations of New Caledonia are privileged partners of the event, being concerned by the key domains that will be addressed by the space, and in priority the 3 central themes: land use, water resources and wetlands (mangroves).

The symposium will be held in Noumea from 28 November to 4 December 2022 and will be attended by private and public players, researchers and future entrepreneurs in the geography and geospatial sectors.
